Yes. Controller of Examination Cell is fully equipped with MIS. OMR Technologies software was installed in the Office of the Controller of Examination as a solution to meet the challenges in Data Base Management. The Technologies used are Optical Mark Recognition (OMR), Barcode reading, optical character recognition and other automation techniques. All data pertaining to students and their academic performance, attendance are obtained accurately in a short span of time.
