6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

The Vision of the college is to produce students who excel in their chosen fields, academically and professionally. Our institution aims at imparting an education not only propels the student up the career ladder, but also makes them a responsible citizen.

Mission statement defines the college's distinctive characteristics in terms of addressing the needs of the society, the students it seeks to serve, College's traditions and value orientations, vision for the future, etc. With the Government assistance, the college provides free tuition, scholarships, free bus pass, career guidance and employment service.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

Yes. Controller of Examination Cell is fully equipped with MIS . OMR Technologies software was installed in the Office of the Controller of Examination as a solution to meet the challenges in Data Base Management. The Technologies used are Optical Mark Recognition (OMR), Barcode reading, optical character recognition and other automation techniques. All data pertaining to students and their academic performance, attendance are obtained accurately in a short span of time.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- Curriculum development committee outlines framework for institution curriculum based as UGC and TANSCHÉ guidelines.
- Training courses on soft skills, value based education, and environmental studies enrich the students knowledge based on Moral and ethical values.
- Organise seminars for students by inviting industrial experts and academicians.
- To motivate the faculty and students by organising National seminars/conferences.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

IQAC provides the room to improve the performance of institution in both Academics and Administration by :

- Preparing students for competitive exams like UGC/CSIR/NET/SLET
- Tutor Ward System ensures the effective functioning of individual progress of the students.
- Computer Literacy Program and Remedial class to be monitored regularly.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Office automation of data pertaining to students and their academic performance is effectively managed by software purchased for 7 lakhs.
- New panel of examiners from 50 colleges including government and aided colleges have been obtained.
- New security features have been incorporated in the mark statement – Fixed Bar code, copy mark, word twist, gold foil, micro logging.
- A systematic work schedule has been formulated and mark statement are released within 28 days on completion of End of Semester Examination.
- Retotalling and Revaluation is regularly done to ensure transparency in evaluation.
